“Corruption Risks in the Field of Free Competition” Anti-Corruption Event

On 22 June, 2016 the Armenian Lawyers’ Association, in cooperation with the CSO Anti-Corruption Coalition of Armenia and the Freedom of Information Centre, is organising in Gavar town an anti-corruption event entitled **“Corruption Risks in the Field of Free Competition”**. The event is aimed at the revelation of the corruption risks existing in the field and outlining respective solutions to the problems.

The event is organised in the scope of the “Multi-Faceted Anti-Corruption Promotion” project funded by the EU and co-funded by the OSCE Office in Yerevan. Representatives of state bodies, business organisations and associations, international and civil society organisations, civil society representatives from Gegharkunik, as well as the experts of the “Multi-Faceted Anti-Corruption Promotion” Project will be attending the event on 22 June.

Mr. Arsen Hovhannisyan, the Head of the Administrative Proceedings Division of the Legal Department of the Staff of RA State Commission for the Protection of Economic Competition, Deputy Governor of Gegharkunik Mr. Andranik Hakobyan, Deputy Mayor of Gavar Mr. Grigor Boshyan and Mr. Karen Zadoyan, the President of the Armenian Lawyers’ Association (ALA), the Coordinator of the Secretariat of the CSO Anti-Corruption Coalition of Armenia, will give welcoming speeches.

The welcoming speeches will be followed by reports and presentations on the corruption risks in the field of free competition, efficient mechanisms of fighting corruption, implemented reforms and upcoming activities, as well as possibilities for cooperation with CSOs in this field. Based on the corruption risks that will be identified at the anti-corruption event, possible solutions to the existing problems will be presented and discussed. The suggestions, after being summarised in the event report, will further be used in contributing to the implementation of reforms in the sphere of free competition and to the significant reduction of the existing problems in the scope of the above-mentioned “Multi-Faceted Anti-Corruption Promotion” project.

The project aims to increase the role of the Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) in promoting anti-corruption reforms and their implementation. In the framework of the project the capacity of CSOs and the media to engage in monitoring and watchdog activities will be built. Anti-corruption training workshops will be organised throughout Armenia with the purpose of enabling CSOs and media organisations to better comprehend the issues related to anti-corruption and freedom of information. These activities aim at deepening the existing opportunities for carrying out anti-corruption activities. Small grants will be given for raising the effectiveness of public monitoring and implementation of appropriate monitoring, watchdog and investigative activities. A sustainable dialogue between CSOs and the Government will be developed with the participation of CSOs, to strengthen the anti-corruption institutional mechanisms.

The project is funded by the European Union and co-funded by the OSCE Office in Yerevan. It is implemented by the “Armenian Lawyers’ Association” NGO – Applicant and “Freedom of Information Center” NGO – Partner. The project duration is 3 years (January 2014 – December 2016) and the budget is 650,000 EUR, of which 585,000 EUR was contributed by the EU and 31,117 EUR was contributed by the OSCE Office in Yerevan.

Armenian Lawyers’ Association (ALA) was established in 1995 with a Mission to promote to the establishment of the rule of law, democracy and formation of the civil society in Armenia, where the people are aware of their rights and where their rights are protected. Before February 2016, ALA was called Armenian Young Lawyers Association.

Freedom of Information Center (FOI) operates over 10 years. The Mission of FOI is to promote application of the RA Freedom of Information Law, contribute to the transparency and openness of the Armenian government system and to stimulate civic society’s involvement in the governance system.
