Expanded Working Meeting of the Government-Civil Society Anti-Corruption Working Group: Working Process on the Criminalisation of Illicit Enrichment in Armenia

On November 17th, 2016, an expanded working meeting of the Government-Civil Society anti-corruption working group (theme: Working Process on the Criminalisation of Illicit Enrichment in Armenia) will be held in the Combined Meeting Room of the Best Western Congress Hotel in Yerevan. Representatives of the Delegation of the European Union to Armenia, the RA Government and other state and local government bodies, the CSO Anti-Corruption Coalition of Armenia, NGOs and mass media have been invited to participate in the working meeting.

The meeting is organised by the Freedom of Information Centre and the Armenian Lawyers' Association in partnership with the CSO Anti-Corruption Coalition of Armenia and the RA Ministry of Justice, along the same lines of the "Multi-Faceted Anti-Corruption Promotion" Project funded by the European Union and co-funded by the OSCE Office in Yerevan.

RA Deputy Minister of Justice Mr. Suren Krmoyan, Mr. Armen Sakapetoyan, the Deputy Chairman of the RA State Revenue Committee adjunct to the RA Government, Mr. Alessandro Zanotta, the Economic Governance and Public Administration Reforms Adviser at the EU Delegation to Armenia, Ms. Naira Gyulnazaryan, the Coordinator of Anti-Corruption Projects at the OSCE Office in Yerevan, Mr. Karen Zadoyan, the President of the Armenian Lawyers' Association and the Coordinator of the Secretariat of the CSO Anti-Corruption Coalition of Armenia, and Ms. Liana Doydoyan, the President of the Freedom of Information Centre, will give opening remarks at the working meeting.

The outcomes of the analysis on the expediency of criminalisation of illicit enrichment in Armenia will be presented at the event. In addition, the public will become informed about the legislative package on criminalisation of illicit enrichment which. The legislative package will be sent to the RA National Assembly after getting approved by the RA Government.

The main goal of the **"Multi-Faceted Anti-Corruption Promotion"** project is to increase the role of the Civil Society Organisations (CSOs) in promoting anti-corruption reforms and their implementation. In the framework of the project the capacity of CSOs and the media to engage in monitoring and watchdog activities has been enhanced. Thus, 100 CSOs and media organisations have strengthened their understanding of corruption issues and freedom of information as well as their ability to monitor and engage in watchdog activities. Small sub-grants have been allocated to 20 CSOs and media organisations for raising the effectiveness of public monitoring and the implementation of appropriate monitoring, watchdog and investigative activities. In 2014 the CSO Anti-Corruption Coalition of Armenia was established in the scope of the project. The Coalition now comprises more than 80 CSOs and media organisations and plays a key role in the sustainable CSO-Government dialogue developed in the scope of the project. The joint work of the Government and the Coalition on the issues of the criminalisation of illicit enrichment and the establishment of an independent anti-corruption agency in Armenia has been a particularly remarkable achievement in the scope of the project. The project is funded by the European Union and co-funded by the OSCE Office in Yerevan. It is implemented by the "Armenian Lawyers' Association" NGO – Applicant and "Freedom of Information Center" NGO – Partner. The project duration is 3 years (January 2014 – December 2016) and the budget is 650,000 EUR, of which 585,000 EUR was contributed by the EU and 31,117 EUR was contributed by the OSCE Office in Yerevan.

The Armenian Lawyers' Association (ALA) was established in 1995 with a mission to promote to the establishment of the rule of law, democracy and formation of the civil society in Armenia, where the people are aware of their rights and where their rights are protected. Before February 2016, ALA was called Armenian Young Lawyers Association.


